Phonics- Early reading.

A few Read, Write, Inc reminders:



- Children will bring home a book bag book on a Friday each week- this is a book that will link in
 with the text that they have read in class that week.. The children should be able to read this book
 with relative ease. We encourage the children to read this book a minimum of three times to develop their fluency and
 comprehension. Please ensure that your child has their book and book diary in school every day.
- The children will also bring home a Reading for pleasure book once a week.. (Year 1 on a Thursday and Year 2 on a Friday) This is a book that the children will choose themselves. They might not be able to decode and read this book independently but it is a book that they can share with their family members.
- The children will have an e-book assigned to them. This will be the book that they have read in school that week and will have an accompanying quiz to go alongside this book to develop their comprehension.




A focus in the classroom.
